22ND INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CAMP HELD IN INDONESIA IN COLLABORATION WITH WAMY & FIMA

Towards an Integrated and Balanced Competency of Life: Navigating Ethics, Culture, and Career

This was the title of the 22nd student camp, where I participated for the first time as a final-year medical student. It was also my first time traveling abroad with people outside my family. What an experience it was—truly out of my comfort zone.

Away from my homeland, away from the culture I was raised in, I was asked to integrate myself into a completely new culture within a mere five days. Thrown to rest under “foreign constellations east, each night above that mound.” I write this article retrospectively back in my homeland. Yet, home feels incredibly different from how I remember it. I now found myself fully integrated into a culture and place I never expected to become part of—not just part of but entirely merged with.

Why would a Bangladeshi, Australian, Malay, Palestinian, Ugandan, British, Kenyan, Pakistani, or South African care about each other? From a worldly perspective, such care might seem impractical. Yet here, it carried an entirely



different meaning, illuminated by our Prophet's words:

عن نرس رضى الله عنه عن ال
 نبى صلى الله عليه وسلم قال: "ثلاث من كن فيه
 وجد بهن حلاوة الإيمان: من يكون الله
 ورسوله أحب إليه مما سواهما، ومن يحب المرء لا
 يحبه إلا لله، ومن يكره أن يعوذ في الكفر بعد أن أنقذه
 الله منه، كما يكره أن يقذف في النار .

Another humbling revelation struck me during the Quran competition. Despite being an Arabic speaker and having memorized the Quran from a young age, the winners were my brothers and sisters who did not have Arabic as their native tongue. I realized that proficiency in recitation and memorization alone is not enough; guidance from Allah and sincere effort are essential. That competition reignited my desire to return to the Quran with a heart sincere in seeking Allah.

Scientific and Cultural Program:

The five days were distributed nicely between the scientific , sport activities , community services for the neighboring communities . At night we gather to express our cultures between Asian, African , Australian and European.

The program was not only theoretical but it was designed to be practiced in our daily life. The skills where prepared by the participants themselves ... Time management , Artificial intelligence, Electronic record keeping, Capturing Opportunities, and Communication skills.

One important workshop almost every one of us needs “Be clear and choose your career” with practical tips and tricks.

It became clear to me how everyone involved was trying their absolute best to excel in every task they had been assigned—whether they were doctors, teachers, presenters, speakers, or participants. I was fortunate to have my mid-semester break during this time, but the majority of participants had to take leave from their universities to attend the camp. Despite this, I witnessed their remarkable dedication to benefiting from the program without falling behind in their studies. They were like bees, tirelessly working with purpose and unity.

Bees during Fajr prayer, as our voices reciting the Quran blended harmoniously with the sound of rain. Bees in the scientific programs, bees in the social programs, bees in the cultural presentations, bees in the scientific presentations, and bees diligently catching up on their studies in between all these activities. Their commitment was inspiring and deeply humbling.

Again, a person must strive for goodness to the best of their ability, but they are not responsible for achieving the results. This is because the outcomes and standards of this world differ from those of the Hereafter. Trading with Allah, the Most Glorious and Exalted, is not governed by human frailty or limited thinking.

This camp didn't just teach me about ethics, culture, or career—it realigned my trajectory. I've always wanted to work in a relief-oriented

career abroad. Participating in this camp brought me a step closer to that goal. The social services were beyond my expectations. I still remember the gasp of surprise from a middle schooler when I introduced myself as a Saudi. Once again, I was appreciated not for any worldly accomplishment but solely because of our shared faith.

True love for Allah requires supporting and befriending a beloved servant of Allah based on perceiving in them closeness to Allah, the Worshipped One. This is why loving the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ is one of the greatest signs of faith, as we know Allah has chosen him above all creation. The same applies to loving angels, messengers, prophets, and righteous people, even if we have no direct connection with them. This is the essence of loving Allah Almighty."

This experience reminded me that to

truly love another human being for the sake of Allah is a blessing that transcends worldly measures. As one of Prophet Dawud's (peace be upon him) supplications beautifully encapsulates:

وعن أبي الدرداء. قَالَ: قَالَ رَسُولُ اللَّهِ ﷺ: كَانَ مِنْ دُعَاءِ دَاوُدَ صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ: "اللَّهُمَّ إِنِّي لَسَأَلُكَ حُبَّكَ، وَحُبَّ مَنْ يُحِبُّكَ، وَالْعَمَلَ الَّذِي يُبَلِّغُنِي حُبَّكَ، اللَّهُمَّ اجْعَلْ حُبَّكَ أَحَبَّ إِلَيَّ مِنْ نَفْسِي، وَاهْلِي، وَمِنْ الْمَاءِ الْبَارِدِ رَوَاهُ التِّرْمِذِيُّ

Abud-Darda' (May Allah be pleased with him) reported:

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "One of Prophet Dawud's supplications was: (O Allah! I ask You for Your Love, the love of those who love You, and deeds which will cause me to attain Your Love. O Allah! Make Your Love dearer to me than myself, my family and the cold water)." [At-Tirmidhi]



I ask Allah subhanah that we will be among those who love one another for the sake of his Glory, as in this reported hadith of Mu'adh (bin Jabal) (May Allah be pleased with him):

The bonds I formed with my campmates were profound. It's hard to believe that we were complete strangers a week before the camp. I initially thought communicating and understanding each other would be difficult, given our different backgrounds, but I was proven wrong on the very first day. Despite language and cultural differences, I felt at home in a very far foreign land.

Allah (سبحانه وتعالى) has made worship easy for us in many ways, including brief reminders speech after each Salah. At our camp, the first prayer we offered together was Dhuhr, immediately following the opening ceremony. No one had prepared a talk, And as a social activity co-leader, I wanted to

establish this activity as meaningful from the start, ensuring it would be taken seriously. The topic for that day's Dhuhr prayer was "Love for the Sake of Allah." Without much preparation, I shared spontaneous thoughts drawn from my limited knowledge. To my surprise, the words I spoke on a whim became the foundation of all the connections and experiences I gained during the program.

I was embraced by people who knew nothing about my past, accomplishments, or struggles. They didn't care about those details; instead, they treated me like family—again, our bond was formed simply by sharing the same faith. This genuine care wasn't limited to the students I met. It extended to everyone involved: resort owners and workers, jeep drivers, pedestrians, school teachers, students, and even the old ladies who attended the general health

screenings we organized. Even small gestures—like the cook making extra sushi for me when I missed my chance to grab some—were a testament to the love and care we shared as Muslims. Their kindness and respect were moving.

The warmth of this experience brought to life the hadith of the Prophet (ﷺ):

عن النعمان بن بشير -رضي الله عنهما- قال: قال رسول الله ﷺ: مثل المؤمن في توادهم وتراحمهم وتعاطفهم مثل الجسد إذا اشتكى منه عضو تداعى له سائر الجسد بالسهر والحمى

Nu'man bin Bashir (May Allah be pleased with him) reported:

Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "The believers in their mutual kindness, compassion, and sympathy are just like one body. When one of the limbs suffers, the whole body responds to it with wakefulness and fever".

Similarly, the Prophet (ﷺ) said:

حديث أبي موسى الأشعري قال: قال رسول الله ﷺ:
المؤمن للمؤمن كالبنيان يشد بعضه بعضاً. وشبك
بين أصابعه

Abu Musa (May Allah be pleased with him) reported:

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "The relationship of the believer with another believer is like (the bricks of) a building; each strengthens the other." He (ﷺ) illustrated this by interlacing the fingers of both his hands.

[Al-Bukhari and Muslim].

I am thankful for many things that I have been blessed with during the program, all Thanks to Allah the Almighty for making me this happy.

I still ask myself whether it was an ordinary seven-day week or if the laws of physics somehow changed, stretching time into several months. During this camp, I accomplished things I couldn't do with people with whom I had spent six years or more. I opened up, cried my eyes out, laughed wholeheartedly, and felt the warmth of an Islamically driven-relationship.

I ask Allah to accept our endeavors and to have mercy on us. I spent the days after this camp reminiscing nostalgically, replaying the memories in my mind over and over. It was a short phase of absolute happiness—a sweetness of heart I had forgotten this life could offer amidst the mundane routine of a medical student. It was a joy I now pray almighty Allah will count for us in the Hereafter.

I have left a part of myself in Solo, and I don't think I will ever get it back.

Finally, our ultimate supplication concludes with the words of our beloved prophet:

نَفْسِي وَاعْتَرَفْتُ بِذُنُوبِي فَاعْفُرْ لِي دُنُوبِي جَمِيعًا لَا يَغْفِرُ
الدُّنُوبَ إِلَّا أَنْتَ لَبَّيْكَ وَسَعْدَيْكَ وَالْخَيْرُ كُلُّهُ فِي يَدَيْكَ

Indeed, my prayer, my sacrifice, my life, and my death are for Allah, Lord of the worlds; no partner has He; with this, I am commanded, and I am of the Muslims. O Allah, You are the Sovereign, none has the right to be worshipped except You. You are my

Lord, and I am Your servant; I have wronged my own soul and have acknowledged my sin, so forgive me all my sins, for no one forgives sins except You. Guide me to the best of characters, for none can guide to it other than You, and deliver me from the worst of characters, for none can deliver me from it other than You. Here I am, in answer to Your call, happy to serve you. All good is within Your hands, and evil does not stem from You. I exist by your will and will return to you. Blessed and High are You; I seek Your forgiveness and repent unto You.

At the end of feelings and memories about the camp, I would like to thank WAMY for caring about young Muslim leaders of the future inshallah over the past 22 years supporting these camps.

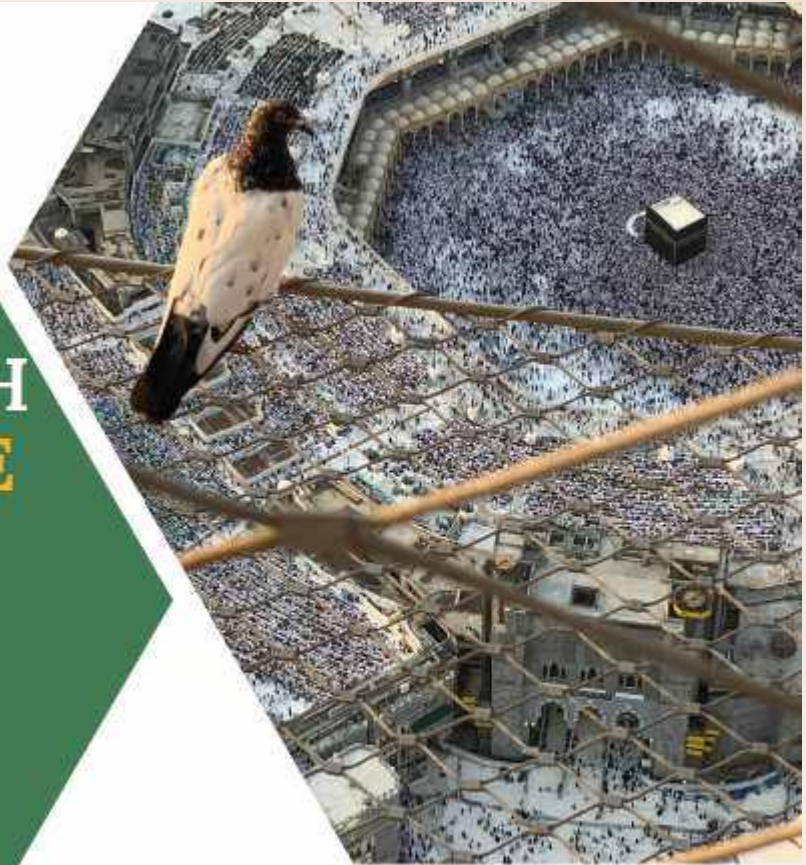
All this was carried by Chartered Boeing 777, myself and Alkhidmat VP Air Marshal R Arshad Malik came along with this cargo plane.
