# IMASA WESTERN CAPE BRANCH



## 1. IMASA SCREENINGS

IMASA Western Cape conducted a total of 14 screenings for the year 2024. Eight were multidisciplinary. The remaining 6 included pre-Ramadhan screenings in Kensington and Ottery, the IMA also assisted other organizations with a screening gazebo at their community events including a Moulid screening program at the Husami Masjid in Cravenby as well as Pink Hijab Day in partnership with Radio VOC and Masjidul Quds. At the various screenings we reached 1500 individuals, and detected 150 new possible diabetics, and another 200 people with hypertension.

## 2. IMASA CONVENTION

IMASA WC also hosted the Annual IMASA Convention and FIMA Annual Meeting. The convention was a collective IMASA effort and was largely successful based on the feedback received from delegates who attended. Every event has its challenges, the convention was unfortunately not an exception.

## 3. PARTNERSHIP DEVOLEMENT

The IMA has developed strategic partnerships with the Al-Imdaad Foundation SA to bring their Vision4Life Cataract project to the Western Cape. We have also facilitated an extension of that partnership with the Melomed Hospital Group and the first fruits of this partnership was achieved when a total of 9 patients in the Western Cape underwent cataract surgery when their respective appointments with the state hospitals were scheduled for a year or two later. Al-Imdaad also provides support at our screening programs where they distribute walking sticks and hygiene packs. The main beneficiaries of this mutually beneficial partnership between IMA and Al-Imdaad is indeed our community.

\* IMASA has now solidified its relationship with the Hanover Park Community Health Centre where we participate in their community wellness program. This year we provided services such as breast and eye screenings, physiotherapy, footcare and dental extractions.

## 4. CATARACT PROGRAM

As previously mentioned, the Cataract program is in partnership with al-Imdaad Foundation. The screening sessions undertaken by IMA were

able to identify patients who have been living with cataracts. These patients were loaded on a database and are now beneficiaries of this program. On Saturday, 7 December, 9 patients underwent cataract surgery at Melomed Hospital Bellville. We look forward to having more cataract surgeries in the near future as our database currently has 41 more patients who still need to undergo surgery.

## 5. CIRCUMCISION

IMASA WC has resuscitated the circumcision program in the WC. We had meetings with Dr Zainul Abideen Parker who previously conducted the program as he has agreed to continue and has committed to train Drs who are interested in participating. Our intention is to have a circumcision camp in the new year In Sha Allah.

## 6. ANNUAL GRADUATION

The Annual Graduation was held on the 5th December 2024 at the Islamia College Hall in Lansdowne. Approximately 67 graduates registered and 63 were present at the event. We expected more registrations based on 2023's turnout but unfortunately this was not the case. The committee is examining potential factors that affected the low turnout of graduates.

## 7. MEDICAL HEALTH FILES

IMASA WC was approached by Radio 786 to restart the Medical Health Files program. The program is conducted on a Tuesday night and started on the 1st October 2024. The program is conducted on a weekly basis.

## 8. FIMA LIFESAVERS

This year the lifesavers program was conducted at Masjidun Nur in Grassy Park. Dr Asma Salloo was the program convener. We had several Drs who assisted as instructors for a group of approximately 60 persons.

## 9. LANGA CLINIC

Langa clinic continue to serve the community of Langa and the surrounding areas. We currently have 2 Sisters on duty every Saturday as well as an admin lady.

## 10. CPD EVENTS

Because we had the convention we didn't focus to much on CPD events for this year. We had a total of 2 events, one being a presentation given by Dr Imtiaz Suliman from Gift of the Givers entitled 'Restoring hope in Humanity' and the other

## VISION PROJECT

Eid gifting for the community.

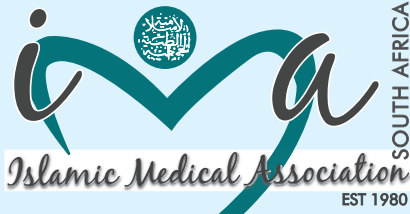
